

## RULES OF THE HUNTER'S HILL GOLF CLUB.

#### Name.

1. The name of the Club is "THE HUNTER'S HILL GOLF CLUB."

#### Management.

2. The affairs of the Club shall be under the management of a President, a Vice-President and a Captain, who shall be ex-officio members of the Committee, and a Committee of five members. The Committee shall elect from amongst the members of the Club an Honorary Secretary and an Honorary Treasurer, who, if not members of the Committee, shall be exofficio members thereof. The Secretary and the Treasurer shall hold office for such periods as the Committee shall direct. The handicapping of members shall be in the hands of a Handicap Committee consisting of three members, with the Captain and Secretary as ex-officio members. At a meeting of the Committee, three shall form a quorum. The seat of any member of the Committee or Handicap Committee who shall be absent from three consecutive meetings of his Committee, or who shall signify to the Secretary his desire to resign, may be declared vacant by the Committee, which may, at its discretion, appoint a successor, who shall hold office only until the next ensuing Ordinary General Meeting. The Committee may delegate to a Committee to be elected by the associate members such powers with regard to associate members as the Committee may think fit.

#### Election of Office-bearers.

3. The President, Vice-President and Captain, at least two members of the Committee, and all the members of the Handicap Committee, shall be elected annually at the Ordinary General Meeting. Two members of the Committee, who shall be selected in such manner as the Committee shall direct from amongst those who have been longest in office, shall retire at every Ordinary General Meeting. Retiring office-bearers shall hold office until the appointment of their successors, and shall be eligible for re-election.

#### Annual Meeting.

4. An Ordinary General Meeting of the Club shall be held annually on such day as the Committee shall appoint in the month of April, at which the Committee shall present a report, and the Treasurer shall submit a statement of accounts, and any business may be brought forward by the direction of the Committee. Seven days' notice of such meeting shall be posted to each member and associate member.

#### Special General Meetings.

5. A Special General Meeting may be called at any time by the Committee, and seven days' notice of such Meeting, and of the business to be brought before it (to which discussion shall be strictly confined), shall be posted in writing by the Secretary to each member and associate member.

#### Election of Members.

6. Every candidate for membership or associate membership shall be nominated by two members, or associate members, in writing addressed to the Secretary. The election of members and associate members shall be by the Committee, in such manner as it shall direct.\*

By virtue of a resolution of the Club the number of members is at present restricted to 35. Candidates for membership must be residents of the district.

### No Membership Until Entrance Fee and Subscription Paid.

7. No elected candidate shall become a member until his entrance fee and annual subscription shall have been paid, and in default of payment within a period of one month from his election, such election shall be *ipso facto* void.

#### Entrance Fee and Subscription.

8. The entrance fee for every member shall be £1 1s., and the annual subscription £2 2s.; provided that the annual subscription for members residing upwards of twenty-five miles from Sydney shall be 10s. 6d.

#### Payment of Annual Subscription.

9. The annual subscription shall be payable on the 1st day of April in each year, and any member failing to pay his subscription within one calendar month thereafter shall, ipso facto, cease to be a member, but may be re-admitted at the discretion of the Committee on payment of arrears.

#### Resignation.

10. Any member wishing to withdraw from the Club, who shall notify that fact to the Secretary, in writing, shall thereupon cease to be a member, but any member whose annual subscription shall be due at the date of such notification shall be liable to pay such subscription.

#### Expulsion.

11. The Committee, at a meeting at which not less than four shall be present, may, by resolution, the voting upon which shall be in such manner as the Committee shall direct, expel any member from the Club, if, in the opinion of those present, he, by his conduct, shall have rendered it undesirable that he shall continue to be a member; provided that no such resolution shall be passed except at a meeting of which at least seven days' notice in writing, stating the nature of

the business to be transacted, shall have been posted to each member of the Committee, and to the member whose conduct it is proposed to consider, who shall have the right of being heard by the meeting.

#### Absentee List.

12. The Committee may place on an Absentee List the name of any member intending to be absent from his usual place of residence for a year or upwards. Every member whose name is on the Absentee List shall pay half the amount of every annual subscription which shall become due during the time that his name shall be upon such list; provided that the Committee may at any time, if such member shall return to reside within ten miles of the Club Links for the time being, remove his name from the Absentee List, and such member shall thereupon become liable to pay the balance of the ordinary annual subscription for the year then current.

#### Honorary Members.

13. Any visitor at Hunter's Hill, Woolwich or Gladesville, as a guest of a member, may be admitted by the Secretary as an honorary member for a period of fourteen days without payment, upon being proposed by a member, and seconded by a member of the Committee, in writing, to the Secretary; and any such honorary member shall have the option of using the Club Links for a further period of three months on payment of the sum of 5s. to the Treasurer in advance each month. The Committee may also elect such honorary members as it may think fit. No honorary member shall take part in the management of the Club, or the election of office-bearers.

#### Visitors.

14. Subject to the approval of the Committee, every member shall have the right of introducing a visitor, residing not less than five miles from the Club Links (for the time being), to play, on giving prior notice to the Secretary; provided that no member shall introduce a visitor to play on a Saturday after 1 p.m., or on a public holiday, on more

than two occasions in each quarter of the year, that not more than five visitors in all shall be introduced on any public holiday, or on Saturday after 1 p.m., and that the right to introduce a visitor shall, subject as aforesaid, be decided by the priority of the notice to the Secretary.

#### Non-playing Members.

15. Non-playing members will not be required to pay an entrance fee, but shall pay an annual subscription, Gentlemen of 10s. and Ladies of 5s., and shall have the privileges of members, except the right to play on the Club Links, or to take part in the management of the Club, or the election of office-bearers. Rules 6, 7, 9, 10 and 11 shall, so far as they are not inconsistent with this rule, apply mutatis mutandis, to non-playing members.

#### Associate Members.

16. Ladies may be admitted as "associate members." Every associate member shall pay an entrance fee of 10s. 6d., and an annual subscription of £1 ls., and shall have all the privileges of members except the right to play on the Club Links on the first, third, and fifth Saturdays in each month after 1 p.m., and the right to be elected as office-bearers. Rules 7, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14 and 15, so far as they are not inconsistent with this rule, shall apply, mutatis mutandis, to associate members.\*

#### Links.

17. The Club Links shall be at such place as the Committee shall from time to time appoint.

#### Rules of Play.

18. The rules of play should be those of The Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St. Andrew's, for the time being officially known to be in force, except as varied, altered, restricted, or extended by the local rules of the Club.

By virtue of a resolution of the Club, the number of associate members is limited to 21. Candidates for associate membership must be residents of the district.

#### Local Rules.

19. The Committee may from time to time make local rules for the regulation of play on the Links, and from time to time alter, vary, cancel, or suspend such rules, or any of them.

#### Alteration of Rules.

20. The Committee may from time to time make rules for the Club, and may from time to time alter, vary, cancel, or suspend these rules, or any of them, or any rules hereafter to be made.

#### Complaints.


21. All suggestions or complaints shall be made to the Secretary in writing.

#### Non-receipt of Notice.

22. No meeting shall be invalidated by reason of the non-receipt of any notice hereinbefore directed to be given.

AMATEUR CHAMPIONSHIP OF N.S.W. AND HAMPDEN CUP.

AMATEUR CHAMPIONSHIP OF N.S.W. AND HAMPDEN CUP.

The match for the amateur championship of New South Wales, which carries with it the right to hold the cup presented by Lord Hampden, was commenced at the links of the Royal Sydney Golf Club at Bondi on Saturday, and will be concluded on the Australian Golf Club's links at Botany next Saturday. A special bogey for both links was decided upon, that at Bondi being reduced from 33 to 73, and at Botany from 37 to 83. The weather for the opening day's play was perfectly calm, and was altogether in favour of good golf. Considerable interest was taken in the play which on the day resulted in a good lead being established by Mr. F. P. Simpson, who proved to be in fine form, especially in the morning, when he did the round in two up. In the afternoon he failed to reach his record of the morning, being two down, which leaves him square or the two rounds. His cards were 76 and 80. Mr. Simpson's morning round was the best for the day. The nearest to the present leader was Mr. H. Macneil, who tied with Mr. Ross for the best after lunch return with one up, but both players suffered by their want of success in the morning, Mr. Nacneil being five down, and Mr. Ross, who runs third, eight down. The latter created quite a favourable impression by his diaglay in the secund round. The holder of the championship, Mr. E. J. B. Macarthur, was a lot below his form. In the morning he was four worse than bogey and five in the afternoon, and it is scarcely possible for him to improve sufficiently at Botany to wipe off the lead secured by Mr. Simpson. Messers. H. W. Fairfax and E. D. Blomfield each played a fairly good game in the morning round, and improvement in the afternoon might have let them in with a good chance next Saturday; but they failed to do better than 10 and 8 down respectively. CHAMPIONSHIP OF NEW SOUTH WALES AND HAMPDEN CUP.

The competition for the amateur championship of New South Wales, which carries with it the right to hold the cup presented by Lord Hamplen in 1898, was brought to a conclusion on Saturday. The first two rounds were played on Saturday, and the result was a win, for the first time, by Mr. E. P. Simpson, whose return at Bondi was "all square," and at Botany, where the bogsy was specially reduced from 87 to 83, 9 down. Twice the new champion was ruuner-up to Mr. Macneil and once to Mr. Macarthur, so that his present success is well merited. The lead gained at Bondi, where he had a rather good advantage over his nearest opponent, Mr. Maoneil, who was four down, pretty well settled the championality, but Mr. Simpson also returned the best gross result at Botany, as well as the best individual round at each course.
