RUST REMOVAL FROM IRON GOLF CLUB HEADS

- 1. Mix 50 gms Citric Acid with 10 gms Thiourea and 500mls warm water.*
- 2. Ensure the head is thoroughly de-greased with petroleum spirits.
- 3. Place the head in the mixture Never place heads with different metals in the "bath" as electrolytic coating may occur.
- 4. Brush with cotton bud or soft brush every 5 mins. To remove surface deposits.
- 5. Leave for 1-24 hours (dep on extent of rust penetration) then rinse under running water for about 5 mins till neutral pH is reached (ie. No more acid)
- 6. De-water in Ethanol or Acetone.
- 7. Coat the head with microcrystalline wax (any furniture wax with a Turpentine base will do)
- 8. Now only handle the head with cotton gloves.
- *The amount of water is not critical you can make a stronger or weaker solution.

VALE - NORMAN VON NIDA

Sadly we said farewell to "The Von" on May 25th. Von died at his retirement village on the Gold Coast. He was one of Australia's finest golfers. Astute judges have told me in the years leading up to WW2 he was unbeatable. The 5 war years robbed him of what should have been his best years.

In 1946 he set sail for Britain and arrived with 17 pounds in his pocket, but he had an unshakeable confidence in his ability. That he set the golfing scene in Britain alight is the stuff of legends.

Von went on then to encourage our young guns to try their luck overseas and helped Bruce Crampton, Bruce Devlin, David Graham, Frank Phillips, Peter Thompson and Jack Newton.

Von was a keen supporter of our society and donated several items from his collection to our museum.
